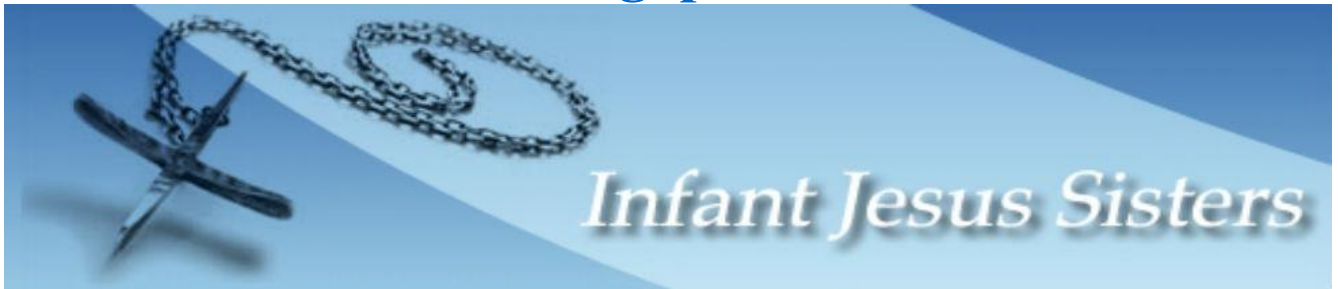

With the opening of Japan in 1872, the Bishop of Japan requested Mother General of the Infant Jesus Sisters to send IJ sisters to Japan to care for the orphans and disadvantaged and give education to girls as they did in France, Malaya and Singapore.

The first team of sisters under the leadership of Mother Mathilde left for the mission from Singapore.

The closing Thanksgiving Mass for the 150th anniversary of the arrival of the Infant Jesus Sisters in Japan was concelebrated by Archbishop Leo Boccardi, Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Tarcisio Isao Kikuchi of Tokyo Archdiocese, and some religious and diocesan priests and lay partners, in the main chapel of St. Ignatius Church on 24 June, at 14:00 Japan time.

The Superior General, Sr Brigitte Flourez, and Sr Jane, General Councillor, were there to grace the occasion. Melodious voices from the choirs of four of our IJ Schools filled the chapel with their rendition of the hymns.

Our IJ Associates together with Sr Maria were there to join in their celebration.

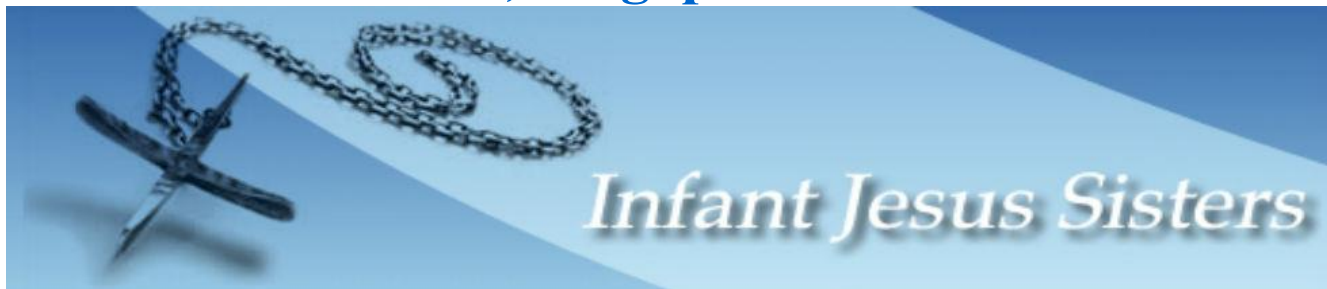

## **Sharing of our overseas missions in Myanmar, Philippines and Laos**

Celebrating the call to go beyond the horizon ...

Blessed Nicolas Barre must have smiled upon the IJ Sisters, Associates and friends who gathered at the Spirituality Centre at Chestnut Drive in Dec 2022 to celebrate the IJ Mission in Myanmar, the Philippines and Laos. Those present were deeply touched by the presenters' commitment, authentic and lived experience of their mission, from its birth to where it is today.

The brainchild of the Asian Provincials to reach out to their neighbours saw the development of trainee and trained teachers in Myanmar, a children's centre for the poor disadvantaged in Cogeio in the Philippines, and the provision of some essential services and education in Laos. This great combined effort of the Asian province (Japan, Malaysia, Singapore and Thailand) bore fruit with the help of willing hearts and cheerful

souls, our lay partners, to bring dignity, justice and peace by sharing resources and promoting the well-being of a people living on the fringes.

Before embarking on the mission in each of the countries, an Asian Mission Team, comprising representatives from each Province, was appointed to make a feasibility study to discern our response to the call to serve. With collaboration and trust in Divine Providence, the project took off.

Ms Jacinta Cardoza presented the mission in Myanmar from the beginnings to where it is now. She shared the challenges faced along the journey in the last 22 years and the joy to see the growth of a community of young sisters and collaborators in Myanmar who decided on an integrative approach through education, that started in helping raise their awareness of their dignity as children of God, and equipping them with free academic and livelihood skills especially in teacher training, culminating in 14 batches of trained teachers.

Sr Neriza's mission in the Philippines is to reach out to the vulnerable and disadvantaged children, give them dignity and uplift them from their plight. Together with her is a team of concerned professionals who works with her through their Social Service outreach. With support from benefactors from Singapore, Sr Neriza, the only IJ Filipino Sister there, has started a children's centre for the little ones of the Infant Jesus. The provision of cooked meals before and after school, gives them the nutrition they need. Sr also provides an environment conducive to learning and guided help in their studies. The centre is equipped with computers for their home-based learning. The children are imbued with values and they pray together. Students who have graduated return to help the younger children on weekends and during the holidays.

Ms Maria Swee shared on our mission in Laos which began with the Asian Mission team visiting Borkeo with a few Thai Sisters who had established some relationships with the locals. Volunteers and benefactors from the other Asian Provinces have been supporting the Team in the different projects in 5 schools - Namhodthai Primary School, Huayjod Primary School, Danthin Secondary School, Pana Primary School and Yangtai school -and have tried to meet some basic needs, like providing clean water, a water trough, a toilet, a food

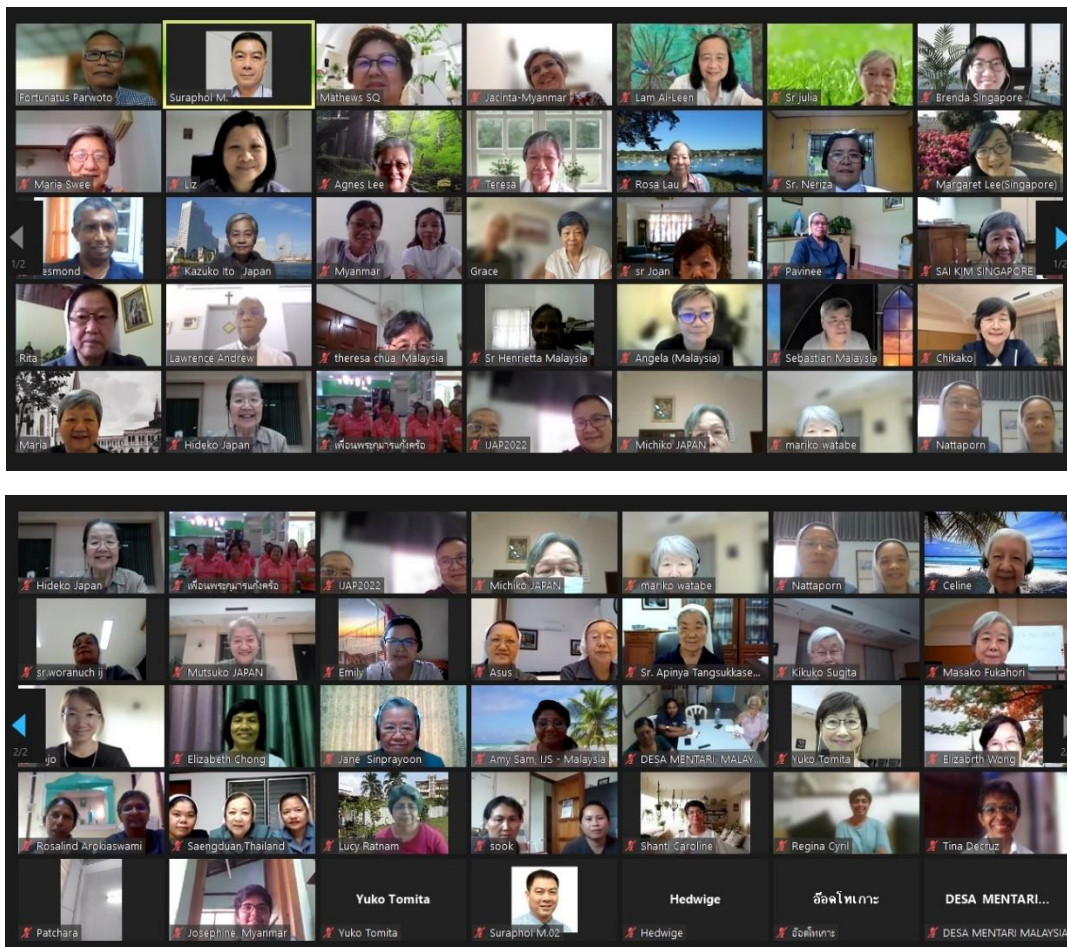

and nutrition programme; in education, like building up a library, computer facilities and teacher training in English. More projects are in the works. The villagers also come on board to help in the various projects.

We pray that the IJ spirit lives on in the overseas missions, touching and transforming the lives of the disadvantaged and forgotten and also those called to respond.

Asian collaboration, when we dream alone, remains a dream but when we dream together, it becomes a reality!

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Asian Forum of IJ Sisters and Lay Partners 2022

The focus of the first day was on drawing inspiration from the Charism, Spirituality and Mission of our founder, Blessed Nicolas Barre, and the ongoing journey of the Sisters and Lay Partners was the focus of the second day.

There were new faces among the group who greeted one another cordially and enthusiastically as members of one IJ family before the forum started.

The participants were warmly welcomed by Sr Jane, General Councillor, who in her opening address set the context and the tone of the forum. Sr emphasized the need to work together to deepen our understanding of our IJ Charism as well as our bond as an IJ Family. It would also foster our growth in spirituality, collaboration and unity among IJ sisters and our IJ lay partners in Asia. Thus, she is hopeful that the meeting would be another source of inspiration, and energy for us to continue our journey together in faith, hope and trust, in order to make Jesus Christ known and loved in our respective places of mission.

[The Song of Asia](#) aptly helped all the provinces to focus as one IJ family in Asia.

[The keynote address](#) by Sr Brigitte, IJ Superior General, inspired the participants to recognise that God's gift through our founder is to be shared with all people within the Church and people of good will. The participants were challenged to listen, discern and respond with generosity, together as Sisters and Lay Partners in the context of our realities today. It is a journey we must all make in solidarity in Asia to continue to synergise and collaborate for God's mission. The unity of purpose in living in union of heart (the link) of spirit (spirituality) and of mission (service to others) with the Sisters and Lay Partners is what will sustain our response.

The forum gave each province and district an opportunity to share its journey with Lay Partners on the first day and their work on the thrust and direction at the local level and as Asia on the second. Each province had time in their breakout groups to discuss their ongoing journey with the Lay Partners and attempt to chart how to further the journey with trust and hope with a Plan of action towards Direction and Thrust which will bring them forward.

The journey with Lay Partners is an ongoing process. It is to introduce them to the IJ Spirituality and legacy of Blessed Nicolas Barre, so that they will be filled with passion and commitment to build a Christ-centred society in our midst.

As the various provinces shared their vision of the direction they intend to take, there was an unspoken call for more communication and bonding, and to share resources and experiences.

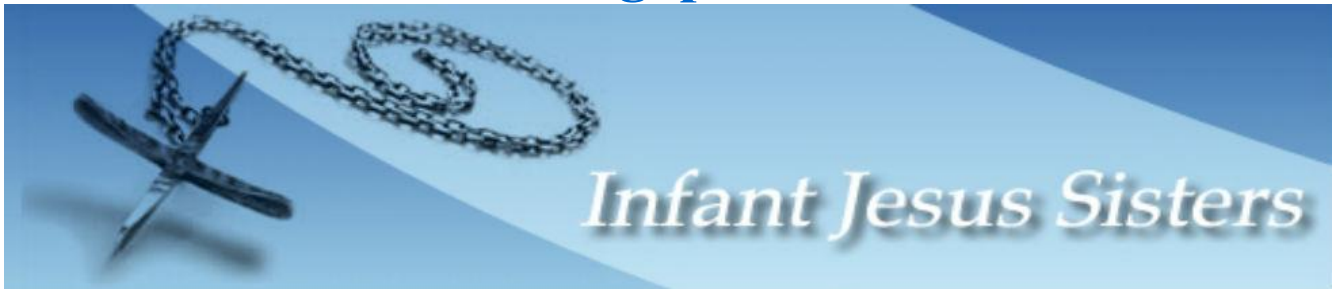
The event was indeed a bridge to build interdependence and improve synergy to work as Asia, hearing the cries of our brothers and sisters in our neighbouring countries.

Fr. Fortunatus Parwoto, our facilitator, in his summary reminded us that our shared experience was a spiritual conversation with the Spirit being among us and leading us.

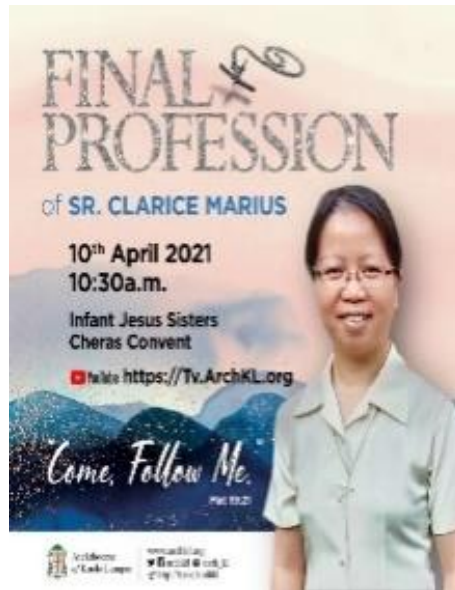

# Sr Clarice to make her final commitment on April 10

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Sr Clarice Marius will be making her final commitment as a sister of the Infant Jesus – Nicolas Barre on April 10 at the IJ Convent in Cheras.

With her motto, *God called and I followed Him* (Matthew 19:21), Sr Clarice shares her vocation story.

"There comes a time when we think of the meaning and purpose of life. This happened to me when I completed my schooling. I come from Kg. Tigot Keningau, Sabah, the

7th child in a family of 10 children. I am a cradle Catholic and my parents instilled in us the love for the Church, family prayer and the Rosary.

"Growing up, I was aware of the realities of children in my village who were deprived of their basic need for an education. After school, I worked temporarily for a year before I enrolled myself at Montfort, Sabah.

"During this period, Sr Teresa Lee (Infant Jesus Sister) came to give faith formation classes. She shared her vocation story and the charism of the IJs. I was attracted to their spirit of courage and zeal and their ways of reaching out to needy children. This automatically resonated with my initial search for meaning in life.

"After a few years, I continued to seriously search with the IJs in Seremban. It was there in mission that I had the opportunity to serve God's children regardless of their race, religion or social standing.

"While working with God's poor I discovered my gift of caring for the sick. After making my first vows, I joined the Tun Tan Cheng Lock College of Nursing (Assunta Hospital). I grew in my religious life and my ministry among the sick, especially the poor.

"Having gained experience over the years in caring for the sick, I believe the time has

come now for me to reach out to the poor, especially in the interior of Sabah, where the people are unable to get basic medical care.

"As I move on to this new area of work, I take with me the theme of our last General Chapter, *'I am sending you on a new path'.*"



The Sisters of the Infant Jesus came to Malaya in 1852 and started their first school for girls in Light Street, Penang.

Today, they have 56 schools under their care, though the nationalisation of the schools in the 1970s did not allow them to resume the initial responsibility of managing the schools till now.

Now the IJ Sisters live among people, with the resolve to remain united in spirit, heart and mission. They continue to serve the Church and the People of God through education and faith formation in the different Learning Centres, Pastoral/parish ministry, Home for the differently-abled women, youth apostolate and various fields where human and spiritual development is needed.

## Asian Forum of IJ Sisters and Lay Collaborators 2019



Asian Forum of IJ Sisters and Lay Collaborators

The Asian Forum of IJ Sisters and Lay Collaborators, organised by the Provincials of Asia, is the fruit of the first Asian Forum of IJ Sisters held in 2016.

The 41 participants from the Provinces of Japan, Malaysia, Singapore and Thailand and the District of Myanmar gathered in St Gabriel's Personal Development Centre, Bangkok from 15 -18 March 2019.

There was so much positive energy and enthusiasm generated when the group of sisters and lay partners met. For many, this was the first time they had encountered each other. The sense of belonging to the IJ "Family" resonated with all.

The warm welcome given by our Thai sisters and the sharing of each one's story of how they came to know the IJ "Family" brought the group closer. The getting to know one another and the fostering of bonds among the participants was one of the stated aims of the Forum.

Other aims included the call:

- \* To deepen the understanding of the IJ Spirituality, the underpinning of the IJ Mission
- \* To have a better understanding of the vocation of the laity as missionary disciples and the vocation of the IJ sisters within the IJ "Family"
- \* To respond to new calls and discover new ways and approaches in our ministries together as the Provinces of Asia.

## ... from Singapore

On the second day, Sr. Maria shared on the IJ Journey with the laity from its foundation to the present day. Time was given for personal reflection. During the group sharing, the participants were invited by Sr Filo, to come up with key words that described the IJ charism.

During the Plenary at the Prayer Space a member of the group shared the meaning of their chosen words. As the participants walked in silence contemplating the words, they were made aware of the realities which concerned people with their struggles, hopes, dreams and doubts. Some realities mentioned were: family breakdown, human trafficking, environmental problems and climate change, individualism, xenophobia, poverty, racial and religious conflicts.

Sr Filo reminded us about the IJ charism, which is life and to make the charism come alive, we must look at the realities of today. It is the charism that expresses itself in the IJ Mission that unites us in our diversity coming from differing cultures, backgrounds and history.

We spent some time looking at the way we live out our *faith/discipleship* in the cultural context where we find ourselves.

The next day saw us looking at the Church's call to the Laity and Religious after Vatican II. Sr Filo gave a presentation on Church - Communion, a New Ecosystem for sharing Charism and Mission and spoke about the Discipleship of Equals.

We then looked at the new path of collaboration as we move into the future.

- \* How do we live collaboration in Mission?
  - \* What are the challenges of collaboration?
  - \* Can we think of any new way – a new structure?

**We spoke about the different levels of collaboration, participation and sharing. Sr Filo, our resource person, reminded us that identification with the founding charism is a pre-requisite and is non-negotiable.**

**The Way Forward – Collaboration for our IJ Mission in Asia and beyond was the topic we discussed in depth and participants came up with concrete ways to do it.**

#### **What is God telling us in the here and now?**

Inspired by the Spirit to continue the journey, the participants feel called to:

- \* deepen our understanding of the IJ spirituality
- \* articulate the process of belonging to the IJ "family", giving recognition and identity to our lay collaborators
- \* have inter-provincial collaboration in Asia, put in place an Asian structure for collaboration and share resources and experience with one another

The feedback was very positive as all felt that this Asian Forum was both inspirational and meaningful and it has brought the Asian IJ "Family" together to take up the challenge of being prophetic witnesses in Asia recognizing there is unity in strength and collaboration.

## Asian Forum of IJ Sisters 2016



The Asian Forum, organised by the Provincials of Asia, was conceived two years ago. The Sisters of Asia from the four Provinces of Japan, Malaysia, Singapore and Thailand gathered in Bangkok with the following aims:

- to get to know each other better and build bonds as IJ Sisters in Asia.
- to listen to God's call to inculturate our Charism in Asia, keeping in focus our prophetic role in Asia today in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century and beyond.
- to look at new ways to respond to the calls and challenges of today and to see together the way forward in our collaboration in mission and the sharing of resources, to cross boundaries or even coming together as one in our response since we share the same vision and heritage.
- to collaborate together on joint projects e.g. formation and mission.
- to look at new forms of membership and
- to look at our interconnectedness and collaboration with our lay partners in mission.

This Asian Forum became a reality on the 6<sup>th</sup> November 2016 when 46 Sisters from the four Provinces came to Thailand to spend the next three days together to see, reflect and share on how they see the future of Religious Life (IJS) in Asia.

We are grateful to Sr Hirota Shizue (Filo), a Mercedarian sister for being our resource person and Sr Kathleen Geaney, a Columban sister for being our facilitator. We are also grateful to Mrs Mathews Shuquo, our lay partner from Singapore, for accepting to be our secretary.

The Asian Forum opened on 6<sup>th</sup> November with a welcome Thai dance by the students of Mary Immaculate Convent School in Chonburi. This culturally rich and graceful dance together with the hospitality by our Thai Sisters set the scene for our Asian Forum in the next few days.

It is a contemplative way of being together; a way of engaging meaningful conversations that are rooted in deep listening ... We listen from an inner silence that creates a space where something **new** can emerge. We come together in a circle of peers, of equals (where no one is an expert, no one is teaching, dominating, persuading). We come with the intention of creating a field of presence and love by grounding our awareness in our hearts, our Source, our interiority, our God. And at the same time, we offer ourselves wholeheartedly to creating communion in this circle as we intentionally listening for something new to emerge.

We practice three skills of contemplative dialogue:

*contemplative listening*

*contemplative speaking*

*and intentionally creating a **WE space** among us as we listen to and build on one another's thoughts. Thus WE space will be a space of the Ruah... being fully aware and attentive to God's gift and grace revealed in the present moment, no matter what is happening in that moment.*

We were posed with challenging questions:

**Listen to what is stirring in you...  
Deal with the diversity...  
Journey towards a new way of being IJs in Asia and in the world...  
Dream... Imagine... Be creative...  
Trusting ... Audacious...**

How do we respond to the challenging reality in a new way?

What is God telling me as I look at the reality of Asia in the light of our Charism?

What is burning in my heart?

What is our dream for a common Asian response as IJs to the reality of Asia today?

This led to the setting up of an Asian Mission Team appointed by the Provincials with members (either a sister or a lay collaborator) from each Province/District to carry out feasibility studies on new calls in other parts of Asia, discern the response with the Asian Provincial Teams and network with existing NGOs. Sisters and lay collaborators, who feel called, have the IJ Spirit and passion for and experience of mission, good health and able to work as a team, are invited to offer their services.

We began each morning with prayer in the prayer space and ended each evening with mass in the chapel.

In the light of our IJ experience of collaboration with lay partners:

- What ways forward/new ways are opening before us?
- Name one or two concrete steps we can take at the Asian level in terms of collaboration with lay partners.
- Another dream is to have our next Asian Forum where both the Sisters and our Lay Partners will participate
- The Forum generated a lot of energy and enthusiasm and all felt that it was worthwhile, inspirational and life-giving.

## **Gathering of Asian Province Sisters at Hua Hin, Thailand**



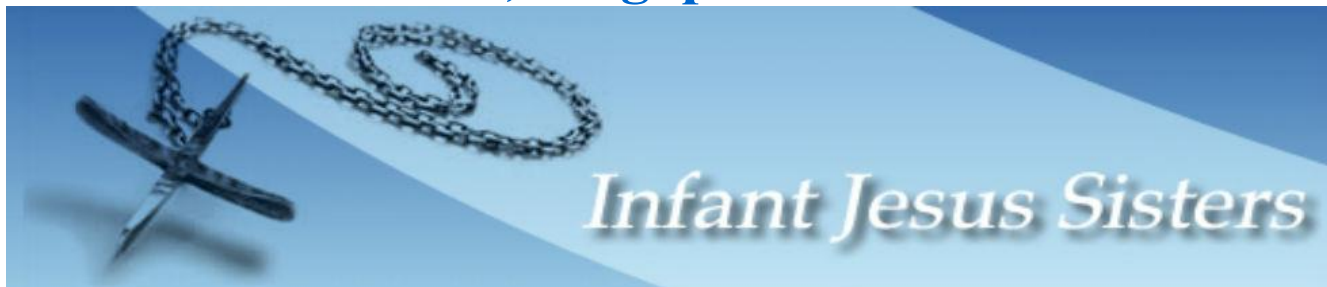

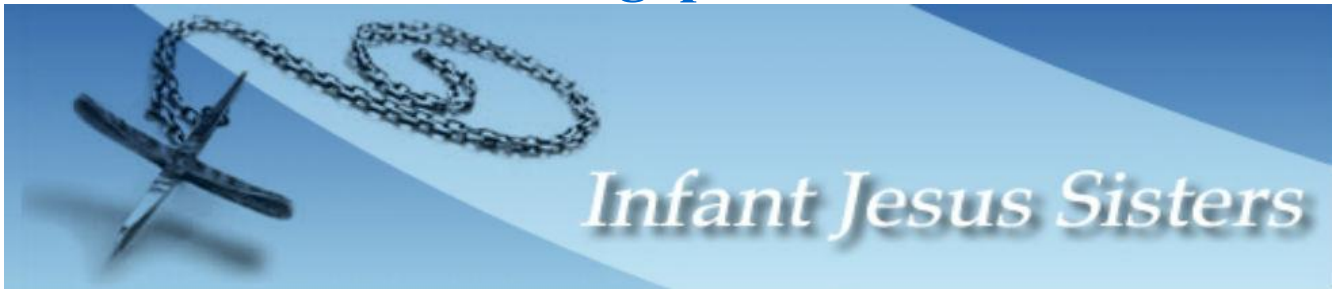

- (4) To have in each province a committee to look at mission awareness and mission development for the future. These committees can network with other provinces in Asia especially.
- (5) To have joint initial formation for the Provinces in Asia, where every Province may contribute to 3 months (as an example) of the formation of our younger members. This will not only help the newer members to have a sense of belonging to the Asian Provinces and the Institute besides the Province they have joined but it will also help in their bonding as IJs.

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we will continue to be co-creators with God, moving forward in faith, hope and love into the future knowing that whatever happens, we can be at peace as we can trust in our God who loves us excessively and unconditionally. "I am with you always" is the assurance given from Jesus.

**Asian Pilgrims in France - June 2015**

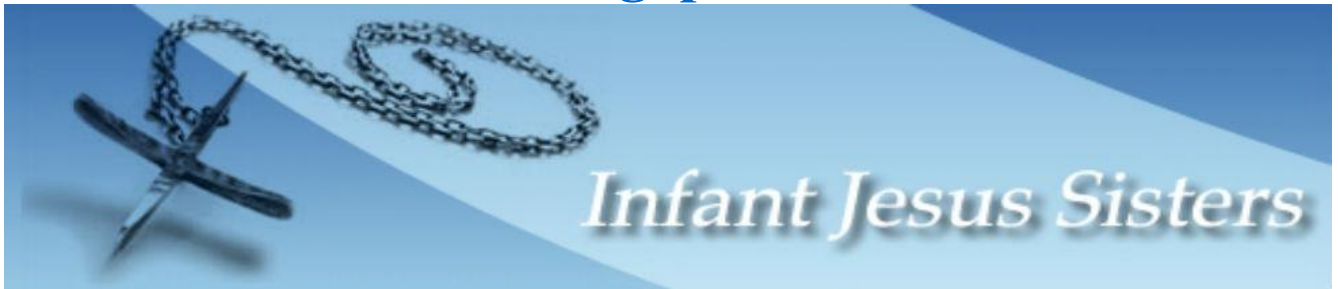
